

# The University of Idaho

Remember to upload a UofI **Class Schedule**, **Cost Verification**, and **Degree Plan** to allow for proper documentation as you input your courses. Here is how you get them off your Vandalweb account:

**UofI Class Schedule:** On Vandalweb go to Student Info, click Concise Student Schedule. Upload it into GoArmyEd by clicking MyEdRecord and then click the e-File tab to upload the file.

**UofI Tuition and Fee Statement:** Use only the form provided by Student Accounts office; GoArmyEd will not accept the tuition and fee statement from VandalWeb. Once your schedule is complete and you will not be dropping or adding courses please send an email to [kclancy@uidaho.edu](mailto:kclancy@uidaho.edu) requesting the correct tuition and fee statement. Include your full name and student ID number in this email. You will receive the tuition and fee statement back as an email attachment within 24 hours, excluding weekends.

**Degree Plan:** Use the ***Degree Audit*** from Vandal Web. Print this document and have it **signed by your Advisor** before submitting it in GoArmyEd.

GoArmyEd will let you submit other documents, but they will not send payment to the University of Idaho without the three documents specified above. Submitting the correct documents to begin with, will ensure the payment is processed smoothly.

Once everything is submitted to GoArmyEd, the ESO will do an initial approval. It will then go into a queue for Pre-Certification by the U of I. Katherine will verify the courses and credits submitted in GoArmyEd match the courses and credits you are enrolled in. Once the pre-certification is done, the file goes back to the ESO for final approval. At that time a **Tuition Assistance Authorization form** is created in GoArmyEd. The Student Accounts office **MUST** receive this document. You can print it and take it to the Student Accounts/Cashiers Office or download it to an email, and send it to Katherine.

Once Katherine receives the TA, your account will be credited for the amount the Army is expected to pay. An invoice is not submitted in GoArmyEd until after the final drop/add date, which is mid-semester.

TE Technical electives. Eighteen credits required and satisfy three conditions: (1) Nine credits (minimum) from the following ECE courses: 410 (S) or 416 (F), 420 (S), 430 (every third semester), 440 (S) or 443 (F), 450 (F) & 460 (F). (2) Three credits (minimum) from upper-division ECE courses, (3) The remaining six credits from upper-division ECE, and approved engineering, math, physics, and computer science courses.  
ES Upper division engineering science elective, a minimum of three credits required. Engineering science elective credits may be obtained from the following courses: ENGR 320, ENGR 335, ENGR 350, MATH 428, physics or other engineering course.  
FE Free Elective

The total credits of ISEM, humanities, social science, international, American diversity, and senior experience must be at least 18 credits and must satisfy the requirement J-3-d found in the UI catalog.

Students majoring in electrical engineering who accumulate grades of D's and F's in mathematics, science, or engineering courses that are used to satisfy graduation requirements, including repeats and transfer courses will be required to undergo special advising as per department bylaws.

Cooperative educational experiences are available through the university Cooperative Education Office and the department co-op coordinator to give the students industrial experience in their chosen field. Academic credit for co-op participation may be earned but may not be used as part of the program of study.

Courses offered only during a semester are identified above with a letter in parentheses by the course number: "F" refers to fall only courses and "S" to spring only courses.
