CRITICAL RESPONSE STEPS

- 1) Ensure the Survivor's and your own safety. Call 911 if necessary.
- 2) Get medical aid if needed for any injuries.
- 3) Contact the SARC or Victim Advocate.
- 4) Protect the Survivor's options and privacy.

Know your part.

Do your part.

What should I do if I've been sexually assaulted?

Get to a safe location. Even though it may be difficult, try to preserve evidence of the assault (don't bathe, wash clothes, etc.). Contact the SARC or a Victim Advocate for assistance with seeking medical care and additional resources. Your communications with the SARC, a Victim Advocate, or a Chaplain remain confidential.

If you become aware of a sexual assault, remember that it is a very traumatic and personal issue. Protect the survivor's rights and privacy by contacting a SHARP representative.

Even if it occurred years ago, you can report a sexual assault at any time.

If I would like to report, what are my options?

Unrestricted

Medical, advocacy, legal, and counseling services are available.

Chain of Command with legitimate need to know and local law enforcement are notified.

Eligible for an expedited transfer, military and/or civilian protective orders.

Confidential LOD determination.

Cannot be changed to a restricted report.

Restricted

Medical, advocacy, legal, and counseling services are available.

Chain of Command and local law enforcement are not notified.

No criminal investigation.

Expedited transfer, military and/or civilian protective orders are not available.

Confidential LOD determination.

May be changed to unrestricted at any time.
